- 2006 AGREEMENT BETWEEN JAPAN & U.S TO RELIEVE MILITARY PRESENCE ON JAPAN SOIL
- 8,600 Marines and 9,000 dependents are being transferred in from Okinawa,
- A Total of 79,000 People, Almost Half As Many As The 180,000 Currently Living On Guam (e.g., Contractors, H-2 Workers, Support Staffs, Etc.)

- UKUDU WORKFORCE VILLAGE, PDN 12 APR 2010 COVERS 75 ACRES OF TAMUNING & DEDEDO,
- AN ESTIMATED 15K – 20K WORKERS FROM OFF-ISLAND WILL BE NEEDED FOR BUILDUP,
- FIRST 2K BEDS READY IN 4TH QTR 2010,
- CORE TECH ACQUIRED ROYAL HAWAIIAN APTS. IN TAMUNING & EL

JAPAN QUESTIONS

'KINDNESS' BUDGET

PDN 2-FEB-2010

- 47K FORCES IN JAPAN = \$2B/YR EXPENSE
- OKINAWA HOUSES 100 U.S. FACILITIES
- 8K MARINES MOVING TO GUAM, WITH JAPAN CONTRIBUTING \$6B OF THE MOVING COSTS
- OKINAWA WAS ONE OF THE BLOODIEST BATTLEFIELDS IN WWII
- U.S. TAXPAYERS PAY \$3.9B/YR TO

COMPENSATION TO OKINAWANS

4-MAR-2010

- JAPAN GOV. WILL ALLOW U.S. MILITARY BASE TO STAY ON OKINAWA,
- OKINAWA RESIDENTS WILL BE OFFERED “COMPENSATION” IN RETURN FOR ACCEPTING JAPAN’S GOV. DECISION,
- DECISION ALLOWS JAPAN-U.S. MILITARY REALIGNMENT AGREEMENT TO CONTINUE,

BECHTEL VISITS GCC

29MAR-10

- \$33B COMPANY THAT HAS COMPLETED MEGA-PROJECTS ON SIX CONTINENTS,
- BECHTEL WOULD HIRE SUBCONTRACTORS TO DO MUCH OF THE MILITARY WORK,
- HOPES TO HIRE SKILLED LOCAL WORKERS TO DRIVE ITS WORK FORCE,
- HIGH SCHOOLS ARE LEARNING CONSTRUCTION SKILLS,
- GCC'S CONSTRUCTION CERTIFICATION PRGM,
- IF BECHTEL COMES FOR THE BUILDUP, THEY WILL NOT STAY.

2011 BUILDUP SPENDING PEGGED AT \$1.3B

PDN 5-Feb-10

- PRES. OBAMA PROPOSES \$566M FOR MILITARY CONSTRUCTION FOR FISCAL 2011,
- EIS PREDICTS \$2.2B FOR FISCAL 2012,
- DELEGATE BORDALLO SUGGESTS DOD LOOK INTO BUILDING WITHIN THEIR EXISTING LAND ON GUAM,
- 12 ARMY “FAST SHIPS” WILL BE BASED ON GUAM, CAN CARRY 300 TROOPS PER SHIP

BUILDUP UTILITIES

COST: \$1.75B

24-MAR-10

- UPGRADES FOR GUAM'S POWER, WATER & WASTEWATER SYSTEMS ARE NEEDED,
- EXPECT 80K MORE PEOPLE ON GUAM BY 2014
- IMPACT ON DRINKING WATER & WASTEWATER COULD THREATEN GUAM'S AQUIFER AND PUBLIC HEALTH,
- DIRECT IMPACT: INCREASED POWER DEMAND, WATER & SEWAGE NEEDS,
- MILITARY IS WILLING TO PAY \$50M TO MAKE UPGRADES AT NORTHERN WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

ECONOMIST: BUILDUP, TOURISM CAN COEXIST

PDN 29-JAN-10

- BUILDUP WILL HAVE A POSITIVE IMPACT ON THE ECONOMY BY PROVIDING JOBS,
- ONLY 25% OF JOBS RESULTING FROM THE BUILDUP WILL BE TAKEN BY LOCAL RESIDENTS,
- PRESSURE FOR INCREASED WAGES COULD IMPAIR COMPETITION WITH INEXPENSIVE ASIAN DESTINATIONS,
- GovGuam's PROJECTED ADDITIONAL INCOME REVENUE OF \$423M IN 2014 WILL BE REDUCED TO \$104M IN ADDITIONAL REVENUE IN 2017.
